



Crimestoppers Local Statistics- April, May and June 2018

Please see the below stats regarding total crime reporting for the Second quarter of 2018:

- Drug Trafficking and Supply is the most reported crime by far, making up **45.37%** of total submissions over the past 3 months.
- The next three most reported crimes for this period are Drink Driving, Disqualified and Uninsured Drivers and Drug Manufacture and Cultivation.
- The busiest month for crime reporting was May with **259** total submissions to Hampshire Constabulary, followed by April with **242**, and June with **217**.
- Total submissions for this quarter was **864**, an increase of **149** submissions from the previous quarter. This reflects our expectations as crime reporting as a whole increases during the spring and summer months.




The below bar graph shows Actionable Information, Positive Outcomes and number of Arrested and Charged;

- **Actionable Information** is identified as an intelligence submission from which *“positive action may be taken to prevent, reduce or detect crime and disorder or to provide intelligence regarding offenders”*. Almost all submissions received by Hampshire Police is **Actionable**.

CRIMESTOPPERS OVERVIEW APRIL-JUNE 2018

- A **Positive Outcome** is when action is taken on the intelligence. This includes house to house enquires, cash/drugs/firearms/weapons recovered, prevention and disruption and safeguarding. A Positive Outcome is action is taken as a **direct result** of Crimestoppers Intel.
- **Arrested and Charged** leads on from positive action, where an individual is arrested and/or charged in a court of law **or** in an out of court sanction (e.g. cannabis warnings).



This quarter yielded a total of **276** positive outcomes, leading to a total of **18** arrests or convictions as a sole result of Crimestoppers submissions.

April was the most successful month for positive outcomes, with a total of **108** submissions leading to a positive action. June however was the most successful month for receiving information which led to **8** arrests or individuals being charging.

- April saw arrests for Disqualified and Uninsured Drivers (3) and Drink Driving (1)
- May saw arrests for Assault and Harassment (1), Drugs Trafficking and Supply (3) Drink Driving (1) and Disqualified and Uninsured Drivers (1)
- June saw arrests for Drug trafficking and supply (2), Drug Manufacture and Cultivation (2), Disqualified and Uninsured Drivers (1), Drink Driving (1) and Wanted persons (1).

The second quarter had significantly more Crimestoppers reports which led to the arrests of individuals.

Again, these numbers do not give a true representation of the role of Crimestoppers intel within Policing. CS submissions help to build up a picture of criminal activity, informing decisions such as PC and PSCO patrols, warrant applications and district targets.


Intel Gaps

Some categories of crime were not reported on at all during this quarter. This may need attention in the Hampshire area as there may be significant intel gaps which have potential to be filled:

- Arson
- Public Order
- Modern Day Slavery

Comparison with previous year

Due to the updated statistics, see below a comparison with previous years regarding total intelligence submissions received to the Hampshire Intel Unit from Crimestoppers:



Whilst the first quarter, between January and March 2018, Hampshire received a total of **715** submissions, compared to **648** over the same period in 2017. Overall, for the first half of the year in 2018 (January to June) Hampshire received a similar number of Crimestoppers reports with **1433** reports in 2018 and **1441** from 2017. There were a significant decrease of Crimestoppers Reports received in June 2018 of **217** compared to the previous year of **293**.

Interesting case

June 2018 -:

Crimestoppers Report received 03/06/18 suggesting that a male was going to travel from Southampton to elsewhere in the UK to throw acid an individual’s face and the male was due to be paid for committing the attack. This report instigated a joint investigation between Hampshire and multiple UK Police Forces which resulted in two individuals being arrested.

Crimestoppers Most Wanted Campaign

The Crimestoppers Most Wanted Campaign ran in Portsmouth, Southampton, Eastleigh and Basingstoke Town Centres on 28th and 29th June 2018.

Hampshire appealed for information relating to **18** Wanted Subjects.

As a result of the Crimestoppers Most Wanted Campaign there were **12** reports directly from Crimestoppers and over **34** Intelligence Reports or Calls made to Police in relation to these individuals as a result of the campaign.

This has resulted in there being arrests or positive outcomes in relation to **15** of the **18** Wanted Subjects.
