





Women's Fellowship Air Ambulance Talk

At our May meeting we welcomed Ryland who came to tell us about the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Air Ambulance service for which he is a volunteer.

The Hampshire and Isle of Wight Air Ambulance started in 2007 although the first one, in Cornwall, began in 1982. On board there are always three people, the pilot, a doctor and a paramedic. In all, Hampshire has 22 doctors, 26 paramedics and 4 pilots. These doctors all work in Hampshire



hospitals as their main employment.

The difference between an ordinary ambulance and an air ambulance is that an air ambulance has a doctor on board who can perform critical care immediately. They can anaesthetise, even amputate should it be necessary. They bring the emergency department to you. Since 2014 they have been carrying blood and plasma.

They are only called to life threatening situations and have to be in the air within 4-6 minutes. They can reach
anywhere in
Hampshire within
15 minutes and the
IoW in 20 minutes.
As well as
helicopters they
also have four
critical care cars



which carry the same kit. Incidents they may be called to are cardiac arrest, road traffic collisions, medical incidents and accidental injuries. They have a special training



room
which can
replicate a
noisy disco
or a busy
motorway
which are
situations
they may
find
themselves
working in.

At the moment they are wanting to locate to Eastleigh and are trying to raise £3.6 million through their Operation Airbase Appeal to fund this. So far they have raised £2 million.

Since 2007 they have been on 13,932 missions!

I think we all agreed that we had learnt a lot from Ryland's visit and it was a very interesting afternoon. Thank you to all who supported us.



Borrowing audience members to help him, Alan demonstrated methods that could be used to confuse the subject's brain, giving the illusion of putting them into a trance. More extraordinary is how hypnosis can be used as an alternative to anaesthetic. A very interesting evening.

Parish Council Notes

June 2025

Devolution

The new mayoral authority is expected to come into effect on the 1st of April 2028 (perhaps a suitable day to have chosen). The new authority will possibly have 5 administrative areas. The Mayor is to be elected in May 2026 and a shadow authority set up in 2027 prior to taking over in April 2028.

TVBC is hoping to be combined with New Forest, Winchester and East Hampshire with no changes to parish boundaries. There will be more consultation prior to the adoption of the final proposals.

Scout Hut

The local scout troop has now vacated the scout hut and the building has now reverted ownership to the PC. The facilities should be utilised for recreational purposes. The District Scouts have expressed an interest in continued use of the facilities

In order to determine the best use of the facilities and a secure financial footing it has been resolved to form a small working group of councillors to make recommendation to the PC

Affordable Housing

Your PC is fighting to increase affordable housing in the village. However, housing associations are selling off property they deem to be uneconomic to bring up to modern standard, and the Council is powerless to intervene.

Affordable housing on the old allotment site may now happen with the injection of some Schedule 106

finance from TVBC, and a housing association to manage them has now been found.

The problem is obviously starting to be recognised as Action Hampshire has received funding from Defra to to bring together communities, local authorities and registered providers to deliver housing that meets local need.

Control of Dogs

We have had a complaint from a runner who has recently been nipped by a dog whilst running on the three fields. This is clearly unacceptable. Dogs will chase moving things so if you own such a dog can you please keep it under control in a manner that does not interfere with other users of the fields. By the same token please pick up after your dog. There are bins sited round the area and keep in mind that whilst you are on the phone or talking to your neighbour your hound could be leaving a deposit that nobody wants to step in. Please pick it up.

Colin Reeve, RIP

Colin Reeve, who passed away on the 10th May, was the man mainly responsible for the very successful Clay Pigeon shoots, held at the Acorn shoot on the Compton Manor Estate between 2009 and 2019.

Back then the Village Hall was in great need of refurbishment and needed to raise funds to start the necessary work. It was thanks to a casual conversation between one of the management team and Colin, in the Crown, about fund raising events that Colin suggested a Clay Pigeon shoot. He was a very experienced shot as well as an International Clay Pigeon shoot referee, so we were able to draw on his vast experience and organised eleven shoots £300,000 which was shared between the Village Hall and Cancer Research U K. A phenomenal sum which is the reason we have such a magnificent hall today. At his funeral it was referred to as the "Gold Plated Hall".

The hall and the village have a lot to be grateful for the short time he spent in the village!

Shortly after he retired from the Metropolitan Polce as a Detective Chief Superintendent he and Maureen, his wife known to many in the village, moved to King's Somborne. He had many stories to tell

about his

life in the Met and perhaps the most infamous being that he was the most senior officer on the dreadful day that WPC Yvonne Fletcher was murdered.

Following his career in the Met he was appointed head of security at Christies Fine Art auctioneers and accompanied Lady Diana to New York while overseeing the sale of her dresses. One of his most treasured possessions is a letter from her thanking him for his efforts in assuring her safety during that time and she also signed an auction catalogue for him.

After the demise of the shoot, he found a new passion of Indoor Short Mat Bowls which he was still playing in the hall until Maureen and he downsized and moved to retirement accommodation. The Short Mat Bowls group continue to use the hall to this day.

It is people such as Colin which makes the Somborne's and surrounding villages such a wonderful community to live in. Rest in Peace Colin, we are most grateful that you passed through, and made such a commitment to, this community.

Ginger Biscuits

Makes 50-55 By popular demand

225g (8oz) butter

200g (7oz) light brown sugar 1 large ecc

225g (8oz) self raising flour 1/2 +

1 tbs ground ginger 1000

4 crystalised stc

In addition:

25 g (1 oz) jumbo oats 25g (1oz) demerara sugar 1 stem ginger, cut into small bits

- 1. Preheat oven to 180 deg C fan. Line 2 or more baking sheets.
- 2. Cream butter and sugar together, then add egg yolk. Add flour, salt and ground ginger to mixture. Add oats and stem ginger to the soft dough.
- 3. Take walnut size lumps and roll into balls and set aside.

- 4. Mix remaining oats, sugar and stem ginger pieces together and press dough balls into the this mixture, pressing down slightly with oaty side up onto baking sheets, leaving space around for spreading.
- 5. Bake for 10-12 minutes until golden. Leave on baking sheet for 5 minutes, before repeating the method.

Maureen began by saying that rural women first got together in a loose association in the early 1900's; these grew when the WI was first founded in 1915, to give women the chance to form friendships for help and support. In 1929, 45 women from 20 countries met together to form the association -ACWW – officially in 1933 – it was born to assist rural women, and has kept to that. 





Several months ago, I planted a batch of tomato seeds in small pots. At the beginning, nothing seemed to happen. Then, more than two weeks later, the tiniest of shoots emerged. Day by day, I've watched them grow by tiny amounts. As I write, they're still not much more than 6 inches high. I've watched them, watered them, transplanted them into larger pots, put stakes in for them, and yearned for their growth. Today, there is a flower on the first plant. It seems I just have to wait while they do what they do, and God does what he does. So slowly, it seems. Waiting. I'm not naturally very good at waiting. I wonder if you are like me in this?

In the natural world, there is a lot of waiting required. And also in the social world and the spiritual world. We must wait while friendships develop. Students must wait for exam results to be issued. I even have to wait to find out if my car passes its MOT test. In the Bible, Jesus's disciples were told to wait for the coming Holy Spirit. All development or growth takes time and requires waiting – even if you tick the next-day delivery box when you order something online!

You'll know that, as a parish, we are seeking the right person to become our new Associate Priest, to lead and serve us in our church and village. We plant, we advertise, we watch, we yearn, we pray. And we wait. Sometimes it feels like we're waiting for a person, but we're really waiting on God. We wait and we choose to trust. He is trustworthy.

And trusting God can, if we let it, lead to peace of mind and spirit. It enables us to see the bigger picture, and when we can't, to trust him anyway. To see beauty in growing things, first flowers on tomato plants. To give and receive love in the middle of hard things. To show courage to overcome pain. To worship. Trusting God helps us to truly live.

May God bless us all this Summer as we trust him.




